Greenville Evening Rotary Club Assists with Habitat for Humanity Build

GREENVILLE, SC (December 3, 2009) – Eight members of the Greenville Evening Rotary Club recently assisted Habitat for Humanity with building a home in Travelers Rest, SC, dedicating a total of 28 hours towards completion of this home.

The Rotary members worked from 7:30 a.m. to 12 noon to assist with painting and priming a home funded by Habitat for Humanity. Despite the early morning hours and the tedious labor, the volunteers thoroughly enjoyed helping with the build.

Habitat for Humanity is a non-profit Christian organization that seeks to eliminate poverty housing and homelessness from the world by building simple, decent and affordable houses for those who lack adequate shelter. These homes are made possible both by volunteers who build the homes and by financial support of individuals, corporations and faith groups. Homeowners are chosen based on their need, ability and willing attitude.

The Greenville Evening Rotary Club is a service organization of local business men and women who participate in numerous community service projects. Most recently, these have included sponsoring the annual Reedy River Ken-Ducky Derby fund raiser; house building with Habitat for Humanities; donating dictionaries to Cashion Elementary School; and sponsoring a new youth values program, Early Act/First Knight, at the Powdersville Middle School. Rotarians traditionally develop community service projects to address many of today's most critical issue, such as children at risk, poverty and hunger, the environment, illiteracy and violence. Rotary Club members worldwide work to achieve the key Rotary objective of "Service above Self." Rotary International is the oldest service club in the world.
